As for *The Beatles in Comics*, this is presented in a series of chapters which start with an article setting the background and then segue into comics re-enacting that part of their history. Each chapter is done by a different artist but the whole is written by one biographer. At 192 pages, the result is an all-inclusive look at the complete history of the band: how it came together, its early days finding its identity where Rhythm 'n Blues were the goal, the many and at times dramatic changes of personnel, and yet its incredible longevity with the core of the band sticking it out together for over 50 years!

And there were some dramatic ups and downs, some terrible experiences such as the infamous Redlands drug bust and the horrendous Altamont concert, a Woodstock gone terribly wrong which may have marked the end of an era. But there were also ever-increasing highs for the bad boys of rock and it is absolutely amazing how much longevity they have ended up showing, both in terms of sticking together and their popularity. Few bands match it.

They are the rebels, the counter-point to the cleaner and ever righteous Beatles which they were in competition with (but hey, they did get a helping hand from them as you'll read about here) because for the Rolling Stones, "*It's only Rock & Roll, but I like it.*" Period. End of story.

You'd have to be an all-knowing Rolling Stone fanatic to not find some information here you didn't know about and for most people, the broad outlines of their history will be familiar, but the juicy details presented here should prove fascinating.

And here's the book for all these generations who've enjoyed them and want to know more!
